## **Strategic Adjustments to the National Squad Management and Selection**

### **Purpose**

The next 5 years sees the Hong Kong National squad competing in Asia Pacific, World Championships and the All China Games culminating in hosting the World Bowls Championship in 2024. The current selection process is archaic and will not provide a proper basis to develop our National team players to compete at the highest level and needs to be reviewed.

### **Proposal to Council**

The High Performance Committee (HPC) is proposing that the current points based system be suspended and the selectors adopt a much broader base from which to start to identify those bowlers who are both talented enough and committed enough to want to play for Hong Kong in these forthcoming major tournaments.

If the Council agrees then the Selectors will extend an invitation to **ALL** bowlers who are eligible to represent Hong Kong to establish a pool in each gender group from which to start the selection process, which will include performance in domestic league and competition, trials and most importantly attitude assessment.

During the same period the HPC will be revamping the coaching set-up and with newly approved funding be looking to employ overseas coaching talent who will then work together with the HPC to further identify those with the right commitment to form 2 elite squads of maximum 10 in each gender group. The players will need to be committed to the plan for at least 2 years and the teams for the next 3 major events will be selected from those elite squads.

If the Council approves the proposal as the HPC intends, then by the end of this squad cycle (April 2019), the whole process will have been completed and the elite squads will have been formed and be training under the new coaching regime. Relevant bye-laws will be amended in due course.

### **The Selection Process**

The recently appointed selectors will remain in post for the usual 12 months tenure but in future will be required to complete a selection form for each event requiring greater detail and reasoning for each selection, which will be scrutinized by the HPC.

The current procedure for selecting the National and U.25 Squads will remain in place for this cycle.

During the course of 2018 we will introduce a revamped selection process for the National Squads to reintroduce National trials which will supplement performances in the domestic league and competitions, so that qualification for a place in the 2019 squad will be more open and competitive. The selectors will be responsible for running these trials and, together with the HPC members, will then select 2 groups of players – 10 of each gender who will form the Elite Squads.

Other players who are not selected for these groups can still be selected for the National Squad and specific International events will utilize these players to give them experience of playing at National level and the opportunity of achieving Elite status at a later date.

Once these squads have been selected by the HPC, together with the coaching staff, will then be responsible for selecting teams for the individual events.

### **Considerations**

This reorganization is brought about by the realisation that, although we by no means disgraced ourselves at World Bowls 2016, we have a long way to go to fully realise the potential of some of our best bowlers. We are hopeful for an increased budget once the hosting of World Bowls 2024 is confirmed and therefore we need to position ourselves now to make best use of that increased funding.

Representing Hong Kong on the World stage should be considered the ultimate accolade for a bowler so we want to make the selection process as open and competitive as possible, whilst at the same time ensuring that we fully satisfy the commitments for securing Government funding, which is so fundamental to our endeavours in the regard.
