The VIIth Commonwealth Games will be staged in Perth, Western Australia, from November 22 until December 1, 1962. All sports venues are within a seven mile radius of the Perth General Post Office. Details of venues are listed below together with a map of Perth and suburbs on page 11 & 12 showing the location of each sports centre.

VILLAGE ARRANGEMENTS

The Commonwealth Games Village will open on November 1, 1962, and close on December 8, 1962. The Village is at Wembley Downs, seven miles from the city and less than one mile from City Beach, one of the most popular suburban surf beaches.

The National Bank of Australasia Ltd., has been appointed official banker for the Games and will provide full banking facilities at the Village, staffed by officers expert in normal banking procedure and in all types of interstat and overseas transactions. The Head Office of the bank in Perth is at 48-54 St. George's Terrace, Perth.

BOOKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR
PERTH COMMONWEALTH GAMES.

The Organising Council has announced the following booking arrangements for the VIIth Commonwealth Games, to be held in Perth Western Australia, from November 22 to December 1 this year.

Overseas: Bookings will be available through national sporting groups, leading travel agencies and Australian Government agencies.

In Australia: Tickets will be sold by leading travel agencies including Ansett-ANA, Dutch Mail Lines, Thos. Cook & Son Pty. Ltd. and TAA, as part of package tours to Perth. West Australian Government Tourist Bureaux in Eastern States capitals will handle bookings.

In Western Australia: Box office agencies in Perth — Boans Ltd., Harris, Searfe & Sandovers Ltd. and Nicholsons Ltd. — will handle sales. Seats at each venue will be reserved for sale from the Perth agencies, beginning later this year.

Overseas and Australian travel agencies should apply for tickets to the Ticket Committee, VIIth Commonwealth Games, Box U-1961, G.P.O., Perth, Western Australia. Individuals can obtain application forms from the same address.

Application forms will include a list of ticket prices, the basic Games programme, and space to apply for both tickets and accommodation. The forms will also indicate the position at each venue of seats at various prices.

Prices for tickets to all venues are expected to be announced late this month. Distribution overseas and interstate of box plans and ticket application forms will begin immediately after.

BOOKINGS AT SYDNEY TRADE FAIR.

Visitors to the Sydney Trade Fair — from August 1 until August 12 — will be able to book seats to the Commonwealth Games in Perth at the Games exhibit in the Western Australia pavilion.

NEW HOTELS AND MOTELS.

Three new hotels and three motels will be built in Perth and suburbs before the Commonwealth Games in November this year.

Hotels are planned or under construction at Riverton, North Perth and Innaloo, and motels are scheduled for Rivervale, Belmont and Bentley Park. All new buildings are within seven miles of the centre of the city.

Motel accommodation will be popular as large numbers of motorists are expected to drive across Eyre Highway, the road link between Eastern and Western Australia. Special efforts are being made to put the road in the best possible condition and service vehicles from automobile clubs will patrol the Highway at Games time.

Officers of the Games Accommodation Bureau have inspected and graded more than one-third of the 2,500 beds available to visitors in private homes. The bureau now can deal immediately with applications for accommodation.

All private home bookings will be on a bed and breakfast basis, with the rental graduated from 25/- a night according to the facilities provided. This scheme is modelled on the one which operated so successfully during the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne and again special efforts are being made to match the interests of host and guest.

How to book accommodation

Games-time bookings at hotels and motels should be made in the normal way through travel agencies and tourist bureaux or through the VIIth Commonwealth Games Accommodation Bureau, 772 Hay Street, Perth, Western Australia.

Because accommodation will be at a premium during the Games, the Accommodation Bureau has organised a hospitality scheme by which visitors will become guests in private homes. So that no visitor will be under any special obligation to his host, this private accommodation will be on a bed and breakfast basis, with the rental graduated from 25/ a night.

The bureau will inspect every home in the scheme, make certain that the facilities offered are good and fix a reasonable rental. The bureau will also take care to match the interests of host and guest as far as possible.

No visitor to the Games need lack friendly, congenial and comfortable lodgings. Private accommodation is available for many thousands in the metropolitan area, a great deal of it in homes in some of Perth's most pleasant suburbs close to the main venues.

The scheme is modelled on the private hospitality system which operated most successfully for the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne, earning a great deal of goodwill for the citizens of that city and Australia.

Most suburban hotels in Perth feature modern and extensive garden-lounge facilities which are open until 10 p.m., often with supper extensions to midnight. These facilities are available to all visitors, whether they are staying in private homes or in the hotels themselves.

How to book your seats

Application forms for tickets and accommodation are available through tourist or travel agencies or from the Ticket Committee, VIIth Commonwealth Games, Box U-1961, GPO, Perth, Western Australia.

Forms include a list of ticket prices, the Games programme, box plans, and space to apply for both tickets and accommodation.

Tickets will be sold direct, as part of package tours, by leading travel agencies including, in Australia, Ansett-ANA, Dutch Mail Lines, Thos. Cook & Son Pty. Ltd., and TAA.

In Perth, three box office agencies, Boans Ltd., Harris, Scarfe & Sandovers Ltd., and Nicholsons Ltd., will sell tickets.

Prices per day for the Games range from 5/ to £3 with a very limited number of £5 tickets for the opening and closing ceremonies at the main stadium.

Prices per session are: opening and closing ceremonies 10/ to £2 with a few seats at £5; athletics (other than the final day), 5/ to £1; boxing, 10/ to £2/10/; cycling, 5/ to £1/10/; road cycling, 10/; fencing, 10/; lawn bowls, 10/; rowing 5/ to £1/10/; swimming, £1 to £3; training sessions, 3/; weightlifting, 8/ to £1; wrestling, 5/ to £1/10/.

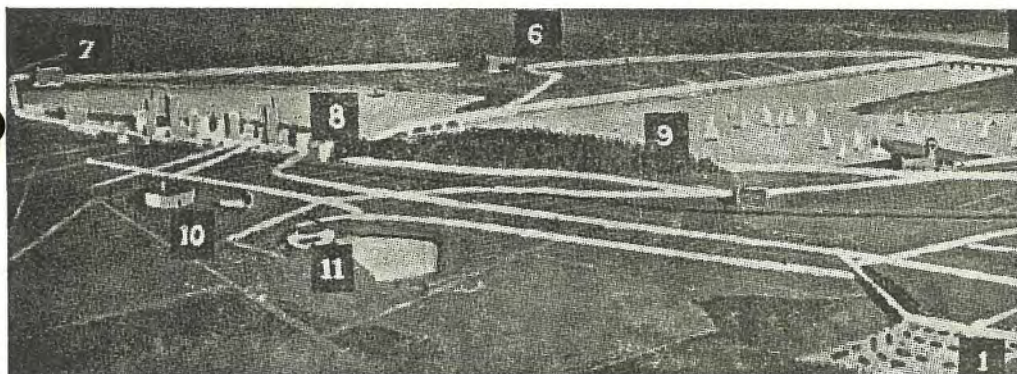

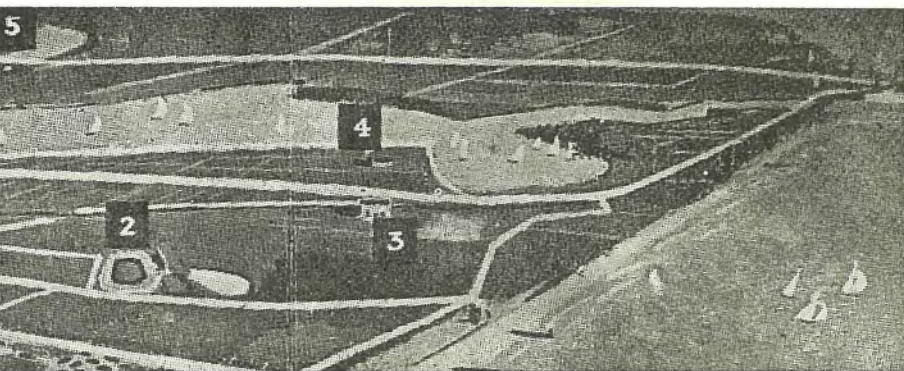

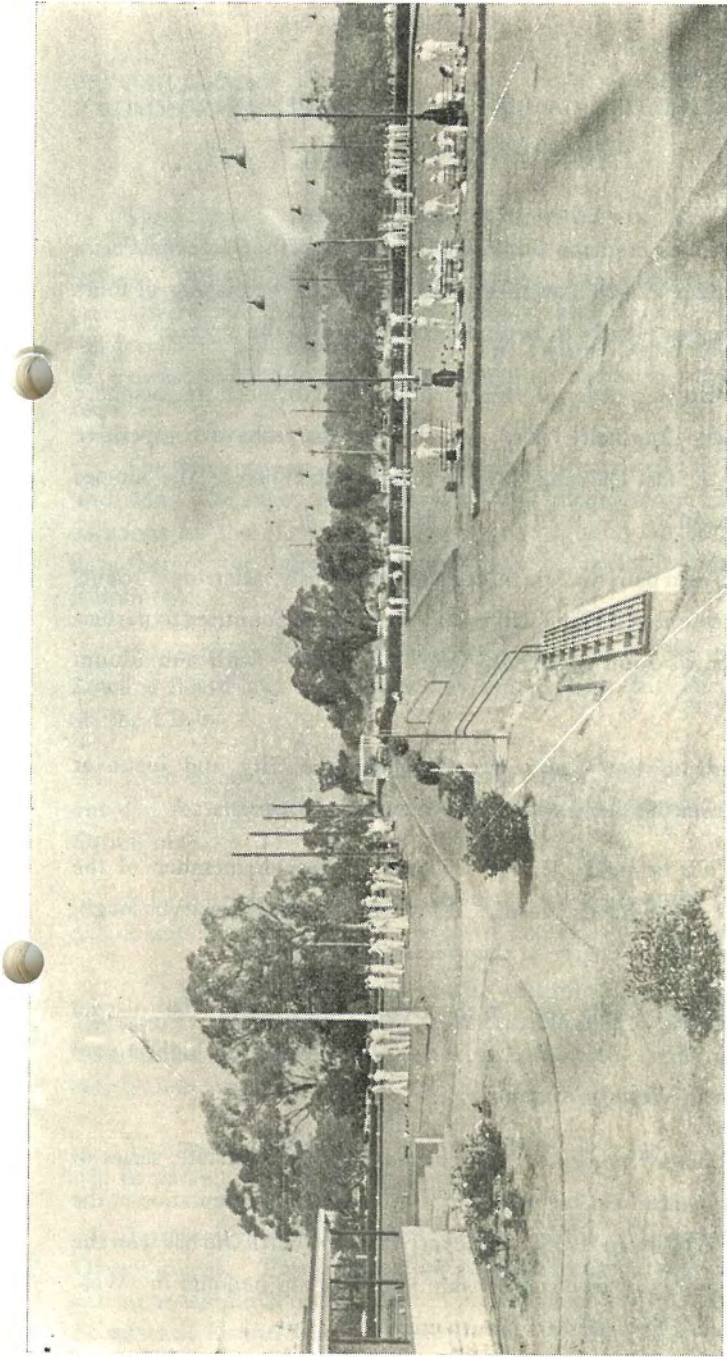

LAWN BOWLS CHANGE

Lawn Bowls events in the VIIth Commonwealth Games in Perth, Western Australia, next November, will begin with the playing of fours to enable singles players to become acclimatised to the greens.

This change in order of events will enable Northern Hemisphere bowlers, who normally play on slow greens, to have competitive practice on the fast Dalkeith Bowling Club greens before the singles and pairs begin.

Singles and pairs will be played simultaneously after fours events have been completed. This will enable competing Countries to participate in all bowls event — singles, pairs and fours — with a minimum of four players.

Dalkeith Bowling Club is five miles from the City and just over five miles from the Games Village at Wembley Downs.

The Club brought Darrell Deacon, a former member of the Queensland State Bowls team, 2,760 miles from Maryborough, Queensland, to take charge of the greens preparations.

Greenkeeper for 25 years to the Doon Villa Club in the district of Maryborough, he took up duties in 1960 as the highest paid greenkeeper in Western Australia.

Mr. Deacon represented Queensland in the interstate series of elimination games held to determine Australian representation at the Games in Cardiff in 1958. Since arriving in Perth he has won the Dalkeith Club's singles championship and took top honours in Western Australia's first Masters Tournament.

LAWN BOWLS CHANGE

The Games Lawn Bowling Committee told Mr. Deacon they wanted greens no slower than 14 seconds and no faster than 17 seconds. When he first went to Dalkeith Mr. Deacon found the greens were not quite level — one was $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches out. Tests of the soil for acidity and alkalinity led to treatment which has resulted in the greens showing, on scientific tests, just the right meter reading required.

The three greens for Games Bowling events will be kept in use until May when they will be rested and then given their final preparations for the Games contests, which begin on November 19, four days before the official opening of the Games by the Duke of Edinburgh.

Competitor's bowls must conform strictly with the International Bowling Board laws of the game and should bear the current stamp of the I.B.B.

Each competing Country will be provided with a distinctive colour disc for attaching to bowls as a ready means of identification during play.

A large scoreboard will be erected in a position which will enable any spectator to see progressive scores of the games.

The Dalkeith Oval, adjacent to the Bowling Club, is being prepared as a parking area for spectators attending the events. The sides of the oval have been cleared and planted with grass and a reticulation system installed.

The centre of the oval will hold about 850 cars and another 400 will be parked around the perimeter.

Temporary seating for 4,207 people will be built round the three Games greens. Two bars will be available at the Clubhouse. Outside cafeterias will be housed under marquees and a special pavilion will be set aside for the Press.

Laws of League And Championship Competitions

The Association shall run each year such Competitions as it may deem fit.

Competitions Sub-Committee

All Association Competitions shall be under the direct control and management of a Competitions Sub-Committee to be appointed by the Committee of the Association and to consist of two officers and not less than three other members of the General Committee.

The Competitions Sub-Committee shall be empowered to make decisions on all matters connected with the playing of competitions without reference to the full Committee. Provided that in the event of any club or player being dissatisfied with a decision made by the Competition Sub-Committee, an appeal for reconsideration of the matter at issue may be made to the full Committee of the Association whose decision shall be final. Any such appeal must be addressed in writing to the Secretary of the Association by the Club concerned or by the appellant player.

Entries for Competitions

Entries for all Competitions shall be received only from Clubs forming the Association and from Members of those Clubs forming the Association.

Entrance Fees

The entrance fees to be charged for all Association Competitions shall be decided from time to time by the Committee.

BYE-LAWS

The I.B.B. Rules and Laws of the game will apply for all Competitions.

League Bye-Laws, 1961.

1. DRESS:—

Dress which MUST be worn at all official games will be brown shoes or boots with no heels, white shirt with white shorts or trousers (Grey flannels permissible for cooler weather).

3. **PROMOTION AND RELEGATION:—**

- A. The bottom team in the First Division will be relegated to the Second Division.
- B. The first team of the Second Division will be promoted to the First Division.
- C. The bottom team in the Second Division will be relegated to the Third Division.
- D. The first team in the Third Division will be promoted to the Second Division.

4. **PLAYING-OFF OF TIES:—**

If on the completion of the league fixtures for the season, two or more teams should tie for first or last places in a particular Division, the number of shots up or down will be the deciding factor.

5. **SCORING OF POINTS IN LEAGUE MATCHES:—**

A total of five points are to be at stake in every league match, that is, two points for a win on aggregate of shots and one point for each winning rink. A draw halves the points.

6. **TIME FOR COMMENCING OF MATCHES:—**

All league matches should commence at 4.00 p.m., or at such time as shall be mutually agreed.

Bye - Laws

7. FILING OF SCORE CARDS:—

Score cards giving detailed results of all games and duly signed by the skips concerned must be filed with the Association to reach the Hon. Secretary not later than 48 hours after the games are played. A duplicate set of score cards for press purposes to be forwarded to K.B.G.C. for games played on the Mainland and C.C.C. for games played on the Island.

8. UNFINISHED GAMES:—

A. When a game of any kind is stopped, either by mutual arrangement or by the umpire after appeal to him on account of darkness or the condition of the weather, or any other valid reason, it shall be resumed with the scores as they were when the game was stopped. An end commenced, but not completed, shall be declared null and void.

B. All unfinished games shall be played within fifteen days of the date originally arranged unless the Competition Sub-Committee directs otherwise.

9. REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS:—

A. Each team must register, before the third league game is played, the names of six of its players which should include three skips and three number threes. During a season a player registered to play for one team is not allowed to play for another team which is in the same or a lower division.

B. Any unregistered player who has played more than four games for one team is not allowed to play for another team which is in a lower division. Any player, regardless of the number of games played, may play in a team in a higher division.

C. A player who has played more than four games for a particular club is not allowed to play for another club in the league in the same season, unless he applies through the Hon. Secretary of the Association and written approval is given on the Authority of the Competition Sub-Committee.

D. In the case of clubs entering more than one team in any particular division, their teams are to be regarded as teams from different clubs and Bye-Laws No.9(C) applies.

E. The Competition Sub-Committee is empowered to deal with all written applications to the Hon. Secretary for transferring of players from one team to another in the same or lower division of the league and their decision shall be final. At least three days notice shall be given for dealing with such applications.

Bye - Laws

10. POSTPONED GAMES:—

A. Postponed games must be played within fifteen days of the date originally arranged unless the Competition Sub-Committee directs otherwise.

B. A game stopped by darkness or weather conditions or by mutual agreement must be resumed with the scores as they were when it was stopped.

C. Due notice must be given of any postponed games to the Competition Sub-Committee through the Hon. Secretary and of the revised date and venue of the postponed games.

11. GAMES PLAYED UNDER ARTIFICIAL LIGHT:—

A league game may be played under artificial light by mutual agreement between the clubs concerned.

12. GENERAL:—

All matters not specifically provided for by these Bye-Laws shall be left to the decision of the Competition Sub-Committee, who reserve the right to add to or make amendments to these Bye-Laws from time to time as they see fit.

COLONY CHAMPIONSHIPS GENERAL RULES

1. Greens.

A. All matches in the Singles, Pairs, Triples and Rink Championships shall be played on neutral greens arranged by the Competitions Sub-Committee. It shall, however, be permissible, should members of the same Club be drawn against each other, for any match, with the exception of the Semi-Finals and Finals to be played on a non-neutral green, the sanction of the Competitions Sub-Committee having first been obtained.

B. The Competition shall assemble on the green or greens arranged by the Competition Sub-Committee, and on a date and at a time fixed. Any competitor who fails to appear within one half an hour of the time fixed shall be disqualified.

2. Umpires:—

The Competition Sub-Committee may nominate individual umpires for matches or may delegate nominators to the Convenor of the Club where matches are arranged to be played. The Umpire shall determine such points as may arise during the course of the play, and the application of the I.B.B. Rules thereto. His decision shall be final.

LAWS OF LEAGUE & CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

3. Entries and Closing Dates:—

Entries must be made through Club Convenors and will close at 12 Noon on the date specified by the Competition Sub-Committee.

4. Draw for Matches:—

The draw will be made in such a manner that byes will occur in only the first round and that the number of matches in the second round will be a multiple of two.

5. Filing of Score Cards:—

The winning player, pair, triple, rink will be responsible for ensuring that the official score card, bearing the signature of both parties, is returned to the Hon. Secretary within 48 hours after the conclusion of the match.

Singles Championship:—

1. The Games shall consist of 21 points, 4 bowls each player.
2. The Champion will hold the 'Bradbury' Club for one year, and the Association will allocate prizes to the Champion and Runner-up from entrance fees received.

Pairs Championship:—

1. The Games shall consist of 21 heads, 4 bowls each player, the leaders to play their 4 bowls before the skips. In the event of a tie an extra head must be played, the points of this head to count in the final score.

2. Each pair shall consist of two men, who may, in any match, play either as No.1 or Skip at their own option.

3. The same player must compete throughout the competition. In the event of illness, death or permanent transfer from the Colony of one of the players, substitution may be allowed of one who has not already competed in the Competition. Only one substitution may be allowed; the original player for whom substitution was made may return, but no further substitution may then be made.

4. The Association will allocate a suitable prize to the Champion Pair and the Runners-up, from entrance fees received.

LAWS OF LEAGUE & CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

TRIPLES Championship:—

1. The Games shall consist of 18 heads, 3 bowls each player. In the event of a tie, an extra head must be played, the points of this head to count in the final score.

2. Each triple shall consist of three men, who may, in any match, play either as 1, 2, or Skip at their own option.

3. The same players must compete throughout the competition. In the event of illness, death or permanent transfer from the Colony of one of the players, substitution may be allowed of one who has not already competed in the Competition. Only one substitution may be allowed; the original player for whom substitution was made may return, but no further substitution may then be made.

4. The Champion Triple will hold the 'Liddell' trophy for one year, and the Association will allocate a suitable prize to the Champion triple and the Runners-up, from entrance fees received.

Rinks Championship:—

1. The Games shall consist of 21 heads, 2 bowls each player. In the event of a tie an extra head must be played, the points of this head to count in the final score.

2. Each Rink shall consist of four men, who may, in any match, play 1, 2, 3, or Skip at their own option..

3. In the event of it being desired to change the composition of the rink prior to the playing of the first round in the Competition, or in the event of one or more of the four players forming a rink being unable to play in the first round, either through absence from Hongkong, or illness or any other reason considered valid by the Competitions Sub-Committee having been first obtained, such player or players may be replaced by others, provided that they have not already been entered in this Competition in the current year. Players entered in a rink in these circumstances shall be deemed original entrants and not substitutes.

LAWS OF LEAGUE & CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

KNOCK-OUT SINGLES

1. The Tournament is open to all bona fide members of the Clubs forming the Association. Entries must be made through Club Convenors on forms provided.
2. The Tournament will be governed by "conditions of Play" as laid down in the Laws of the Game.
3. All rounds up to the quarter-finals shall consist of 17 points, 4 woods each player, and the semi-final and final shall be of 21 points.
4. All games shall be started at time stated in the programme, subject to umpires rulings, and any player not on the green and ready to play within 10 minutes from starting time shall be disqualified and the game awarded to their opponent.
5. The winner shall be accorded the title of "Tournament Singles Champions" and shall hold the "Willie Russell" memorial trophy for one year, and the runner-up shall hold the "G. C. Norman" memorial award for one year.
6. The Association will appoint an umpire to each green used and he shall be responsible for the enforcement of the Laws of the Game. Each game shall be controlled by a marker.
7. At the conclusion of each game, the marker after having the completed score card signed by each player shall himself sign before handing to the umpire for immediate transmission to the organising Secretary appointed by the Association.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

1. Member Clubs of the Association shall nominate the current winner of their respective Singles Lawn Bowls Club Championships.
2. That the Colony Open Singles Champion for the past year will be entitled to enter the competition as the Association's nomination, but if he is also his Club's nominee he will then represent his Club.
3. That an entrance fee of \$20.00 will be charged each Club for their respective player nominated.
4. That the competition will be conducted in accordance with the Association's General Competition Rules and Laws of the Game.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

5. That the competition will be played as a Singles Competition, where a competitor will play each and every competitor entered, and points will be awarded to the winner of each game, the highest number of points being the winner of the competition.

6. That the winner's Club may hold the Champion of Champions Trophy for one year only.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION (GUTTIERREZ SHIELD)

1. The International competition for the Guttierrez Shield shall be held under the auspices of the H.K.L.B.A.

2. A player shall be qualified to represent a Nation, Country or Colony provided that he shall be:—

- (a) A bona fide member of a club affiliated to the Assn.
- (b) Been born in, be a citizen of, or become a naturalized citizen of the Nation, Country or Colony concern.

3. The Association reserves the right to request any entrant to submit proof or evidence of his qualification to represent a Nation, Country or Colony.

4. As of this year, a player shall be deemed to have represented a Nation, Country or Colony if he shall have been officially nominated to represent that Nation or Country or Colony and shall have accepted such nomination. Thereafter, he shall not be allowed to play for any other Nation, Country or Colony.

5. One rink is to constitute a team in this competition. Each Nation, Country, or Colony is entitled to enter more than one team, which will be designated 'A' 'B' 'C' etc., but should more than one team be entered, then that Nation, Country or Colony will be required to play off an elimination series amongst themselves under direction of the H.K.L.B.A. to ascertain which one rink will represent that Nation, Country or Colony in the Competition.

6. The Association shall appoint a Convenor and a sub-committee of two (2) from the list of entries for the purpose of selecting the team(s) of the Nation, Country or Colony.

LAWS OF THE GAME

AS ORIGINALLY FORMULATED BY
THE SCOTTISH BOWLING ASSOCIATION
REVISED AND ADOPTED BY
THE INTERNATIONAL BOWLING BOARD, 11TH JULY, 1946.
AS FURTHER REVISED AND ADOPTED, 12TH JANUARY, 1951.

I.—THE GREEN.

(1) *Area and Surface:*

The Green should form a square not longer than 44 yards or shorter than 33 yards: or a rectangle of which the longer side should not be more than 44 yards and the shorter side not less than 33 yards.

Where local circumstances prevent compliance with these requirements National Associations may admit greens which have their longer side not more than 44 yards and not less than 33 yards, and their shorter side not less than 21 yards (i.e., wide enough for 3 rinks).

The green shall have suitable playing surface which shall be level. It shall be provided with suitable boundaries in the form of a ditch and bank (it is recommended that in future all new greens shall be not less than 42 yards square).

(2) *Ditch:*

The ditch shall run round all the green. It shall be not less than ten inches and not more than fifteen inches wide and shall have a holding surface not injurious to bowls which shall be not less than four inches nor more than six inches below the level of the green.

(3) *Banks:*

The banks shall not be less than nine inches above the level of the green, preferably upright, or alternatively, at an angle, of not more than a hundred and ten degrees from the surface of the green. No steps likely to interfere with play shall be cut in the banks.

(4) *Division of the green:*

The green shall be divided into spaces called rinks, which for the purposes of competitive play, should be not less than nineteen feet or more than twenty-one feet in width. They shall be numbered consecutively, the centre line of each rink being marked on the bank at each end by a wooden pin or other suitable device. The four corners of the rinks shall be marked by pins made of wood or other suitable material painted white, and fixed on the

LAWS OF THE GAME

face of the bank and flush therewith. These corner pins shall be connected by a green linen thread drawn tightly along the surface of the green, with sufficient loose thread to reach the corresponding pins on the face of the bank in order to define the boundary of the rink when required.

White pins or discs shall be fixed on the side banks to indicate a clear distance of twenty-seven yards from the ditch on the line of play.

The boundary pins of an outside rink shall, in competitive play, be placed at least two feet from the side ditch.

II.—MAT : JACK : BOWLS : FOOTWEAR.

(1) *Mat:*

The mat shall be not less than eighteen nor more than twenty-four inches in length and not less than twelve nor more than fourteen inches in width. It shall be laid with its longer side parallel with the line of play.

(2) *Jack:*

The jack shall be round and made of white porcelain, or composition, with a diameter of two and a half inches, and ten ounces in weight.

(3) *Bowls:*

(A)

Bowls shall be made of wood, rubber or composition and shall bear an individual and distinguishing mark. They shall be black or brown in colour. Bowls made of wood shall not exceed $16\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in circumference nor $3\frac{1}{2}$ lb. in weight. Loading of bowls made of wood is strictly prohibited. Bowls made of rubber or composition shall not after 1st January, 1954, exceed the grade of weight for size as aftermentioned.

(B) *Bias of Bowls.*

A bowl shall have a bias not less than that approved by the International Bowling Board and shall bear the imprint of the stamp of the International Bowling Board. To ensure accuracy of bias and visibility of stamp, all bowls shall be re-tested and re-stamped every tenth year.

(In order that congestion be avoided and bowl testers given ample time for accurate testing, National Secretaries shall arrange, on a rotary system, with Clubs, Districts or County Associations the regular delivery of all bowls.)

(C) *Objection to Bowls.*

A bowl to which exception is taken during the course of play shall be tested by comparison with the standard bowl by a bowl-testing officer of the Board.

(D) *Alterations to Bowls.*

A player shall not alter, or cause to be altered other than by an official bowl tester, the bias of any bowl bearing the imprint of the official stamp of the Board, under penalty of suspension from playing for a period to be determined by the Council of the National Association of which his club is a member. Such suspension shall be subject to confirmation by the Board or a Committee thereof appointed for that purpose and shall be operative among all Associations in membership with the Board.

(E) *Footwear.*

Players and markers shall wear brown or black, smooth rubber soled, heel-less footwear while playing on the green, or acting as markers.

III.—ARRANGING A GAME.

(1) *General form and duration:*

A game of bowls shall be played on one rink or on several rinks. It shall consist of a specified number of shots or heads, or shall be played for any period of time as previously arranged.

LAWS OF THE GAME

(2) *Selecting the rinks for play:*

When a match is to be played, the rinks to be played on shall be drawn at the green by the skips or their representatives.

In a match for a trophy or where competing skips have previously been drawn, the draw to decide the numbers of the rinks to be played on shall be made by the visiting skips.

No player in a competition or match shall play on the green on the day of such competition or match before play commences, except in trial ends, under penalty of disqualification.

This law shall not apply in the case of organised open tournaments.

(3) *Play arrangements:*

Games shall be organised in the following play arrangements:

- (A) As a single game.
- (B) As a team game.
- (C) As a series of single games or team games.
- (D) As a special tournament of games.

(A) *A single game* shall be played on one rink of a green as:

- (a) A single-handed game by two contending players, each playing his bowls singly and alternately.
- (b) A pairs game by two contending sides of two palyers, who shall play their bowls singly and in turn, the two leads playing first.
- (c) A triples game by two contending sides of three players, who shall play their bowls singly and in turn, the leads playing first.
- (d) A rink game by two contending sides of four players, each member of the rink playing two bowls singly and in turn.

(B) *A team game* shall be played by two contending sides, each composed of an equal number of players and arranged to play as rinks of players.

LAWS OF THE GAME

(C) Games in series shall be arranged to be played on several and consecutive occasions, as:

- (a) a series of sequence of single games organised in the form of an eliminating competition and arranged for competing single-handed, pairs, triples or rinks of players.
- (b) A series or sequence of team matches or contests, organised in the form of a league competition, or an eliminating competition, or of inter-association matches or contests.

(D) A special tournament of games:

Single games and team games shall also be arranged in group form as a special tournament of games in which the contestants play each other in turn; or they may play as paired-off sides of players on one or several greens in accordance with a common timetable, success being adjudged by the number of games won, or by the highest net score in shots in accordance with the regulations governing the tournament.

(4) *Awards:*

No cash prize or monetary stake shall be played for, presented or received.

All prizes shall be in kind.

IV.—STARTING THE GAME.

(1) *Trial ends:*

Before start of play in any competition, match or game, or on the resumption of an unfinished competition, match or game on another day, not more than one trial each way shall be played.

(2) *Tossing for opening play:*

The leads in a single rink game, or the captains in a team game, shall toss to decide which side shall play first, the winner of the toss to decide.

In all ends subsequent to the first the winner of the preceding end shall play first.

(3) *Placing the mat:*

LAWS OF THE GAME

At the beginning of the first end the player to play first shall place the mat on the centre line of the rink, the back edge of the mat to be one yard from the ditch.

Where ground sheets are in use at first and every subsequent end the mat shall be placed at the end of the sheet, its back edge being one yard from the ditch.

(4) *The mat and its replacement:*

After play has commenced in any end the mat shall not be moved from its former position. Should a player, however, inadvertently move the mat in course of play it shall be restored to its former position.

(5) *The mat in subsequent ends:*

In all subsequent ends the player throwing the jack shall place the back edge of the mat either:

(a) One yard from the ditch, or

(b) at a point between the position of the jack at the close of play in the preceding end and one yard from the ditch, provided always that there is a clear distance of twenty-seven yards between the front of the mat and the opposite ditch, and that the mat when so placed is on the centre line of the rink of play.

(c) Should the jack be thrown into the ditch, or outside the boundary of the rink or less than 25 yards in the straight line of play from the front of the mat, the opposing player may then move the mat in only a backward direction in the line of play, and throw the jack, but shall not play first. Should the jack be improperly thrown for the second time in any end, the back edge of the mat shall be placed one yard from the ditch, and no further movement of the mat shall be permitted until the completion of the end.

(6) *Stance on mat:*

A player shall take his stance on the mat and, at the moment of delivering his bowl, shall have one foot remaining entirely within the confines of the mat. The foot may be either in contact with or over the mat. Failure to observe this Law constitutes foot-faulting.

LAWS OF THE GAME

(7) *Foot-faulting:*

Should a player, after having been warned by the umpire, again infringe the law on foot-faulting, the umpire shall have the bowl stopped and removed to the bank.

(8) *Throwing the Jack:*

The player to play first shall throw the jack. If the jack be thrown to a distance less than two yards from the opposite ditch it shall be moved out to that distance and straightened.

(9) *Jack improperly thrown:*

Should the jack in any end be thrown into the ditch or outside the side boundary of the rink or less than twenty-five yards in a straight line of play from the front of the mat, the opposing player shall throw the jack, but shall not play first.

The jack shall be returned as often as it is improperly thrown, but the right of the player first throwing the jack in that end to play the first bowl of the end shall not be affected.

V.—MOVEMENTS OF BOWLS.

(1) *“Live” bowl:*

A bowl, which in its original course on the green comes to rest within the boundaries of the rink, and not less than fifteen yards from the front of the mat, shall be accounted a “live” bowl and shall be in play.

(2) *“Touchers”:*

A bowl, which in its original course on the green touches the jack, even though such bowl passes into the ditch within the boundaries of the rink, shall be accounted a live bowl, and shall be called a “toucher.” No bowl shall be accounted a “toucher” by being played on to, or by making contact with the jack, while the jack is at rest in the ditch.

(3) *Making a “toucher”:*

A “toucher” shall be clearly marked with a chalk mark by a member of the side whose bowl has been played before the delivery of the succeeding bowl. Failure so to mark a “toucher” which comes to rest in the ditch shall render the bowl “dead.”

(4) *Action of “toucher”:*

“Touchers” may act on the jack or on “touchers” in the ditch.

(5) *Bowl accounted “dead”:*

LAWS OF THE GAME

A "non-toucher" bowl which finishes in the ditch, or a bowl, including a "toucher," which comes to rest entirely outside the limits of the rink of play or which has been driven beyond the side boundaries of the rink, or a bowl which comes to rest within fifteen yards from the front of the mat, shall be accounted "dead", and shall be removed to the bank.

Care should be taken to remove toucher marks from the bowls before these bowls are played in the succeeding head. Should a bowl be played with such marks not removed, the marks shall be removed immediately the bowl comes to rest, except if such bowl has become a "toucher" at the end in play.

A bowl is not rendered "dead" by a player carrying it to the jack end.

(6) *Bowl rebounding:*

"Touchers" rebounding from the bank to the rink shall remain in play. "Non-touchers" rebounding from the bank, or from the jack in the ditch or from "touchers" in the ditch to the rink shall be accounted "dead" and shall be removed to the bank.

(7) *Bowl displacement:*

(a) Displacement by rebounding "non-toucher":

A bowl displaced by a "non-toucher" rebounding from the bank shall be restored as near as possible to its original position.

(b) Displacement by participating player:

If a bowl, while in motion or at rest on the green or a "toucher" in the ditch, be interfered with or displaced by one of the players, the opposing skip shall have the option of:

(i) Restoring the bowl as near as possible to its original position;

(ii) Letting it remain where it rests;

(iii) Declaring the bowl "dead"; or

(iv) Playing the head anew in the same direction.

(c) Displacement by non-player:

LAWS OF THE GAME

If a bowl, while in motion or at rest on the green, or a "toucher" in the ditch, be interfered with or displaced by any individual not playing in the rink, or by a bowl from another rink, or by any object, the two skips shall come to an agreement regarding its position. The two skips failing to agree, the head shall be played anew in the same direction.

- (d) Displacement inadvertently produced:
If a bowl be moved at the time of its being marked or measured it shall be restored to its former position.

(8) "*Line*" bowls:

- (a) Estimating "line" bowls in play:

A bowl shall not be accounted as outside any circle or line unless it be entirely clear of it. This shall be ascertained by looking perpendicularly down upon the bowl or by placing a square on the green.

- (b) Lifting the boundary thread:

The boundary thread shall not be lifted if the lie of "line" bowl is jeopardised thereby, but otherwise it shall be permissible for the side in play to lift the side boundary thread to allow a bowl to travel freely, but the thread shall be restored to its former position after the bowl shall have passed.

VI.—MOVEMENT OF JACK.

- (1) "*A live jack in the ditch*".

If the jack be driven into the ditch within the limits of the rink it shall be accounted "live" and shall not be moved except by another "toucher." Its place shall be marked by a white peg of suitable material one inch broad, to show not more than three inches above the level of the green and placed immediately in line with and above the place where the jack rests.

- (2) *A jack accounted "dead"*:

Should the jack be driven by a bowl in play wholly beyond the boundary of the rink, i.e., over the bank or over the side boundary or into any opening or inequality of any kind in the bank or rebound to a distance less than twenty-five yards in a direct line from the centre of the front of the mat to the jack in its rebounded position, it shall be accounted "dead."

LAWS OF THE GAME

(3) *“Dead” end:*

When the jack is “dead,” the end shall not be counted a played end, even though all the bowls have been played. The end shall be played anew in the same direction.

(4) *Playing to boundary jack:*

The jack, if driven to the side boundary of the rink and not wholly beyond its limits, may be played to on either hand and if necessary a bowl may pass outside the side limits of the rink. A bowl so played which comes to rest within the boundaries of the rink shall not be accounted “dead.”

If the jack be driven to the side boundary line and come to rest partly within the limits of the rink, a bowl, played outside the limits of the rink and coming to rest entirely outside the boundary line, even though it has made contact or makes contact with the jack, shall be accounted “dead” and shall be removed to the bank.

(5) *A damaged jack:*

In the event of the jack being damaged, another jack shall be substituted and the end shall be played anew in the same direction.

(6) *A rebounding jack:*

If the jack be driven against the bank and rebound on to the rink, or if it rebound from a “toucher” in the ditch on to the rink, or after being played into the ditch it be operated on by a “toucher” so as to find its way on to the rink, it shall be played to in the same manner as if it had never left the rink.

(7) *Jack displaced by player:*

If the jack be diverted from its course while in motion on the green or displaced while at rest on the green or in the ditch by any one of the players, the opposing skip shall have the jack restored to its former position, or allow it to remain where it rests and play the end to a finish, or play the end anew in the same direction.

(8) *Jack displaced by non-player:*

If the jack, whether in motion or at rest on the rink or in the ditch, be displaced by a bowl from another rink or by any object or by an individual not a member of the rink, the two skips shall

LAWS OF THE GAME

decide as to its original position, and if they are unable to agree, the end shall be played anew in the same direction.

(9) *Jack displaced by "non-toucher":*

A jack displaced in the rink of play by a "non-toucher" rebounding from the bank shall be restored, as near as possible, to its original position. Should a jack, however, after having been played into the ditch be displaced by a "non-toucher" it shall be restored to its marked position.

VII.—RINK PLAY.

THE BASIS OF THE GAME OF BOWLS IS RINK PLAY

(1) *The rink and rink play:*

(a) Designation of players:

A rink shall consist of four players, named respectively lead, second, third and skip, according to the order in which they play, each playing two bowls.

(b) Order of play:

The leads shall play their two bowls alternately, and so on, each pair of players in succession to the end.

No one shall play until his opponent's bowl shall have come to rest.

Except under circumstances provided for in Law XI (1) the order of play shall not be changed after the first end has been played under penalty of disqualification, such penalty involving the forfeiture of the match or game to the opposing side.

(2) *Possession of the rink:*

Possession of the rink shall belong to the side whose bowl is being played.

The players in possession of the rink for the time being shall not be interfered with, annoyed or have their attention distracted in any way by their opponents.

As soon as each bowl shall have come to rest, possession of the rink shall be transferred to the other side, time being allowed for making a "toucher."

LAWS OF THE GAME

(3) *Position of players:*

Players of each rink not in the act of playing or controlling play shall stand behind the jack and away from the head or behind the mat.

As soon as a bowl is delivered, the skip or player directing it in front of the jack, shall retire behind it.

(4) *Players and their duties:*

(a) The skip:

The skip shall have sole charge of his rink and his instructions shall be obeyed by his players.

With the opposing skip he shall decide all disputed points and when both agree their decision shall be final.

If both skips cannot agree, the point in dispute shall be referred to and considered by an umpire, whose decision shall be final.

(b) The third

The third player may have deputed to him the duty of measuring any and all disputed shots.

(c) The second:

The second player shall keep a record of all shots scored for and against his side. He shall see that names of the players are entered on the score card, shall compare his record of the game with that of the opposing second player as each end is declared, and at the close of the game shall hand the score card to his skip.

(d) The lead:

The lead shall place the mat and shall throw the jack ensuring that the jack is properly centred before playing his first bowl.

VIII.—RESULT OF END.

(1) *"The shot":*

A shot or shots shall be adjudged by the bowl or bowls nearer to the jack than any bowl played by the opposing player or players.

LAWS OF THE GAME

When the last bowl has stopped running, half a minute shall elapse, if either side so require, before the shots are counted.

Neither jack nor bowls shall be moved until each skip has agreed as to the number of shots, except in circumstances where a bowl has to be moved to allow the measuring of another bowl.

(2) *Measuring conditions to be observed:*

No measuring shall be allowed until the end has been played out.

If a bowl requiring to be measured is resting on another bowl which prevents its measurement, the best available means shall be taken to secure it in its position, whereupon the other bowl shall be removed. The same course shall be followed where more than two bowls are involved, or where in the course of measuring a single bowl is in danger of falling or otherwise changing its position.

When it is necessary to measure to a bowl or jack in the ditch, and another bowl or jack on the green, the measurement shall be made with the ordinary flexible measure. The calipers may be used to determine the shot only when the bowls in question and the jack are on the same plane.

(3) *“Tie”—no shot:*

When at the conclusion of play in any end the nearest bowl of each team is touching the jack, or is deemed to be equidistant from the jack, there shall be no score recorded. The end shall be declared “drawn” and shall be counted a played end.

IX.—GAME DECISIONS.

(1) *Games played on one occasion:*

In the case of a single game or a team game played on one occasion, or at any stage of an eliminating competition, the victory decision shall be awarded to the player, side or team of players producing at the end of the game the highest total score of shots, or in the case of a “game of winning ends,” a majority of ends.

(2) *Tournament games and games in series:*

In the case of tournament games or games in series, the victory decision shall be awarded to the player, side or team of players

LAWS OF THE GAME

producing at the end of the tournament or series of contests either the largest number of winning games or the highest net score of shots in accordance with the regulations governing the tournament or series of games. (Points may be used to indicate game successes). Where points are equal, the highest average score shall decide.

(3) *Playing to a finish and possible drawn games:*

If in an eliminating competition consisting of a stated or agreed upon number of ends, it be found, when all the ends have been played, that the scores are equal, an extra end shall be played, the jack being thrown by the lead of the side which won the previous end. This procedure shall continue until a decision is reached.

X.—DEFAULTS BY PLAYERS IN RINK PLAY.

(1) *An absentee player in any rink:*

(a) In a competitive single rink game:

In a match for a trophy, prize or other competitive award where a club is represented by only one rink, the members of such rink shall be *bona fide* members of the club. The failure of all four players to appear and play after a period of thirty minutes, or the introduction of an ineligible player, shall cause the side at fault to forfeit the match to the opposing side.

(b) In a team game:

If, within a period of thirty minutes of the time fixed for the game, a single player is absent from one or both sides in a team game, whether a friendly club match or a match for a trophy, prize or other competitive award, the game shall proceed, but in the defaulting side or rink, the number of bowls shall be made up by the lead and second players playing three bowls each, but one-fourth of the total shots scored by each side or rink playing three men shall be deducted from their score at the end of the game. Fractions shall be taken into account.

(2) *Two or more absentee players:*

(a) In an ordinary single rink game:

LAWS OF THE GAME

If, within a period of thirty minutes of the time fixed for the game, fewer than three players appear on either side, the game shall not proceed, and the side at fault shall be held as having failed to appear and shall forfeit the game.

(b) In a team game:

Should such default take place where more rinks than one are concerned, or where a rink has been disqualified for some other infringement, and where the aggregate or average scores are to decide the contest, the scores of the non-defaulting rinks only shall be counted, but such average shall, as a penalty in the case of the defaulting side, be arrived at by dividing the aggregate score by the number actually engaged in the game.

(c) In a domestic rink game:

Where in a domestic rink game the number of players cannot be accommodated in full rinks of four players, three players may play against three players, but shall suffer the deduction of one-fourth of the total score of each side. A smaller number of players than six shall be excluded from that particular game.

(3) *Play irregularities:*

(a) Playing out of turn:

When a player has played before his turn, the opposing skip shall have the right to stop the bowl in its course and it shall be played in its proper turn, but, in the event of the bowl so played having moved or displaced the jack, or a bowl, the opposing skip shall have the option of allowing the head to remain as it is after the bowl so played has come to rest, or of having the head played anew from the same end.

(b) Playing the wrong bowl:

A bowl played by mistake shall be replaced by the player's own bowl.

(c) Changing bowls:

A player shall not be allowed to change his bowls during the course of a game, or in a resumed game, unless they be

LAWS OF THE GAME

objected to as provided in Law II, 3 (c) or when a bowl has been so damaged in the course of play as, in the opinion of the umpire, to render the bowl (or bowls) unfit for play.

(4) *Play interruptions:*

(a) Game stoppages:

When a game of any kind is stopped, either by mutual arrangement or by the umpire after appeal to him on account of darkness or the condition of the weather, or any other valid reason, it shall be resumed with the scores as they were when the game was stopped. An end commenced, but not completed, shall be declared null.

(b) Substitutes in a resumed game:

If in a resumed game any one of the four original players in any rink be not available, one substitute shall be permitted. Players, however, shall not be transferred from one rink to another.

XI.—INFLUENCES AFFECTING PLAY.

(1) *Leaving the green:*

If during the course of a team, rink, pairs or triples game a player has to leave the green owing to illness, or other reasonable cause, his place shall be filled by a substitute, if in the opinion of both skips such substitution is necessary. Should the player affected be a skip, his duties and position in a rink game shall be assumed by the third player and the substitute shall play either as lead, second or third. Such a substitute shall be a member of the club to which the rink belongs.

If during the course of a single-handed game a player has to leave the green owing to illness or other reasonable cause, the provision of Law X (a) shall be observed.

No player shall be allowed to delay the play by leaving the rink or side, unless with the consent of his opponent, and then only for a period not exceeding ten minutes.

Contravention of this law shall entitle the opponent or opposing side to claim the game on match.

LAWS OF THE GAME

(2) *Objects on the green:*

Under no circumstances, other than as provided in Law VI (1), shall any extraneous object to assist a player be placed on the green, or on the bank, or on the jack, or on a bowl, or elsewhere.

(3) *Unforeseen incidents:*

If during the course of play the position of the jack or bowls be disturbed by wind, storm or by any neutral object actuated by reason of such disturbance, the end shall be played anew in the same direction, unless the skips are agreed as to the replacement of jack or bowls.

XII.—DOMESTIC ARRANGEMENTS.

(1) *Local arrangements:*

Constituent clubs of National Associations shall, in making their domestic arrangements, make such regulations as are deemed necessary to govern their club competitions, but such regulations shall comply with the Laws of the Game and be approved by the Council of their National Association.

(2) *National arrangements:*

Overseas Member Nations shall also, in circumstances dictated by climate or other local conditions, make such regulations as are deemed by their National Council necessary and desirable.

(3) *International matches:*

International matches and matches of test importance, arranged or sanctioned by the International Bowling Board, shall be played under the Laws of the Game as laid down by the Board.

(4) *National visiting teams:*

No team of bowlers visiting overseas or the British Isles shall be recognised by the International Bowling Board unless it first be sanctioned and recommended by the National Association to which its members are affiliated.

(In order to regulate such visits and the movements of touring parties, it is recommended that intimation of each proposal be made by member nations to the Board twelve months in advance.)

(5) *Contracting out:*

No club or club management committee shall have the right

LAWS OF THE GAME

or power to contract out of any of the Laws of the Game as laid down by the International Bowling Board.

XIII.—REGULATING SINGLE-HANDED, PAIRS AND TRIPLES GAMES.

The foregoing laws, where applicable, shall apply to single handed, pairs and triples games.

XIV.—SPECTATORS.

Persons not engaged in the game shall be situated clear of and beyond the limits of the rink of play and clear of verges. They shall preserve an attitude of strict neutrality, and neither by word nor act disturb or advise the players.

Betting or gambling in connection with any game or games shall not be permitted or engaged in within the grounds of any constituent clubs.

XV.—DUTIES OF MARKER.

- (1) The marker shall control the game in accordance with the I.B.B. Laws. He shall, before play commences, examine all bowls for the imprint of the I.B.B. stamp, such imprint to be clearly visible, and shall ascertain by measurement the width of the rink of play.
- (2) He shall centre the jack and shall place a full-length jack two yards from the ditch.
- (3) He shall ensure that the jack is not less than twenty-five yards from the front of the mat after it has been centred.
- (4) He shall stand still at one side of the rink and to the rear of the jack.
- (5) He shall answer affirmatively or negatively a player's enquiry as to whether a bowl is jack high. If requested, he shall indicate the distance of any bowl from the jack, or from any other bowl, and also, if requested, indicate which bowl he thinks is "shot."
- (6) He shall chalk all "touchers" and mark the position of the jack and "touchers" in the ditch (*see Law VI (1)*). He shall remove all "non-touchers" from the ditch and all "dead" bowls to the bank.

LAWS OF THE GAME

- (7) He shall not move, or cause to be moved, either jack or bowls until each player has agreed as to the number of shots.
- (8) He shall measure carefully all doubtful shots when requested by either player. If unable to come to a decision satisfactory to the players, he shall call in an umpire. If an official umpire has not been appointed, the marker shall select one acceptable to each player. The decision of the umpire shall be final.
- (9) He shall enter the score at each end and shall intimate to the players the state of the game. When the game is finished, he shall see that the score card, containing the names of the players, is signed by the players and disposed of in accordance with the rules of the competition.

XVI.—DUTIES OF UMPIRE.

An umpire shall be appointed by the Secretary of the Association, Local Secretary, or by the Club or Tournament Management Committee. His duties shall be as follows:

- (1) He shall, in rink, triples and pairs games, examine all bowls for the imprint of the I.B.B. stamp, and ascertain by measurement the width of the rinks of play.
- (2) He shall measure any shot or shots in dispute, and for this purpose shall use a suitable measure. His decision shall be final.
- (3) He shall decide all questions as to the distance of the mat from the ditch and jack from mat.
- (4) He shall decide as to whether or not jack and/or bowls are in play.
- (5) He shall enforce the Laws of the Game.

Ladie's League Bye-Laws

1. (a) The bottom team in the First Division will be relegated to the Second Division.
- (b) The first two teams of the Second Division will be promoted to the First Division.

PLAY-OFF OF TIES

If on the completion of the league fixtures for the season, two or more teams should tie for first or last places in a particular Division, the number of shots up or down will be the deciding factor.

3. SCORING OF POINTS IN LEAGUE MATCHES

A total of two points are to be at stake in every League match, that is, two points for a win and one point for a draw.

4. A. Any player who has played two or more games for one team is not allowed to play for another team which is in the same or a lower division. Any player, regardless of the number of games played, may play in a team in a higher division.
- B. A player who has played in 2 or more League games for a particular club is not allowed to play for another club in the League in the same season.
- C. In the case of clubs entering more than one team in any particular division, their teams are to be regarded as teams from different clubs, and Bye-Law No. 7 (B) applies.
- D. The Ladies Sub-Committee is empowered to deal with all written applications to the Ladies Hon. Secretary for transferring of players from one team to another in the same or Lower divisions of the League and their decision shall be final. At least three days notice should be given for dealing with such applications.

Ladies League Bye - Laws

(Contd)

5. POSTPONED GAMES

- A. Postponed games must be played within fifteen days of the date originally arranged unless written approval from the Ladies Honorary Secretary is given on the authority of the Ladies Sub-Committee.
- B. A game stopped by darkness or weather conditions or by mutual arrangements must be resumed with the scores as they were when it was stopped.

6. APPEALS AND COMPLAINTS

All appeals or complaints against any infringements of the above League Bye-Laws must be made in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Association within 48 hours of the occurrence of the infringements.

7. A league match may be played under artificial light by mutual agreement between the clubs concerned.

NOTE:—All matters not specifically provided for by these Bye-Laws shall be left to the decision of the Association Competition Sub-Committee, who reserve the right to add to or make amendments to these Bye-Laws from time to time as they see fit.

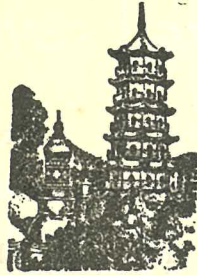
