## THE OFFICERS

Firstly, many thanks must go to the Officers of the General Committee for carrying out much of their work without the benefit of a sub-committee. The 1st Vice President, Ken Wallis, has taken on the formidable task of Chairman of the 4th Pacific Bowls Championship Committee. Meetings during the early stages are being held every two months. Ken is also a member of the Classic Organising Committee.

The Hon. Secretary, John Armitage, was responsible for handling the considerable amount of correspondence and administration work arising from the operation of a very busy Association. John, as Chairman of the National Selectors, did a fine job in chairing his panel, of Dennis Blyth, Philip Chok, Pat George and Larry Parker, in what must be the most unenviable task of all in selecting the Hong Kong squads from the many fine bowlers available. John has also managed the

successful Commonwealth Games Mens team in February and served on the Classic and Pacific Organising Committees.

The Hon. Treasurer, Roger Pickford, completed his eight successive year in this office. During this period, he has built up the financial resources of the Association to the healthy position currently existing. He also plays an important role on both the Classic and Pacific Organising Committees as well as liaising with the Sports Development Board on funding the Association's various activities.

This year, the Summer League, which was again sponsored by Ballantines Whisky, featured 40 teams. The League Chairman, Bob Gartan, together with his long suffering committee of Brian Poynton, M.B. Hassan, Bob Brown and Wyndson Ho, did a splendid job which at times, became rather frustrating when team captains failed to ring-in the results.

The National Competitions Chairman, Larry Parker and his committee of Peter Cheung, Mel Stewart and Rick Bailey should be congratulated for the smooth running of a very busy fixture list. Thanks must also go to the convenors who offered their greens for the National Competitions, especially when their players were not involved.

## UMPIRES

During the year, 22 bowlers had taken the umpires exams and it was gratifying to see the new bowlers taking an interest in these exams. Thanks must also go to George Sperring, the Chief Umpire, for his enthusiasm and dedication to his task.

## WINTER LEAGUE

The Association was again fortunate to have the continued sponsorship of this league by Jacky Wong (Berlitz Shipping Co. Ltd). This company also sponsored an Invitational Singles and Pairs tournament with prize money being given. The event was due to be held on the 17th and 18th of June but due to heavy rain was postponed until October, when only the Pairs tournament was able to be completed. Ken Wallis and Mel Stewart were the victors of this keenly fought event and it is hoped that this event can be an annual fixture.

## VICTORIA PARK TRAINING COURSES

These courses have again proved very successful with demand outstripping the available green space.

The hard working volunteer coaches and the Liaison Office Norrie Razack, have done excellent work in producing bowlers of a very high standard on a bowling surface which is on par with any football pitch in the region.

Next year sees the long awaited redevelopment of the Victoria Park Bowling Greens and it is to their credit that Victoria Lawn Bowls Club and City Lawn Bowls Club have produced such fine bowlers without the facilities and green maintenance that other clubs take for granted.

Also during the year, a Four Year development plan was prepared and submitted by both Associations, to the Sports Development Board. Emphasis was placed in this plan for the development of bowls at public venues.

## BOWLS TOURS

Two overseas Associations and many Club tours were hosted in the year. In February, the English Bowling Association sent a touring party including past and current officials who were hosted by the Police Officers Club, Hong Kong Football Club and the Kowloon Bowling Green Club. In September, it was the turn of the Royal New South Wales Past Presidents tour who were hosted by the Police Officers Club, the Hong Kong Football Club and the United Services Recreation Club. The Association would like to thank the above clubs and their members for their hospitality to our overseas visitors.

The Officers of the General Committee would like to wish all bowlers a happy and successful bowling year of the Ram.

# The Hongkong Bank International Lawn Bowls Classic

## report by Gordon Dunwoodie

THE SOUZA Classic Singles — customary curtain-raiser for the Hongkong Bank Classic Pairs event — got off to a damp start when heavy rain hit the Colony and seriously curtailed the opening days programme.

Only 10 of the scheduled 16 first-round matches beat the weather and the entire second-round had to be held over until the second day, causing headaches for both competitors and organisers alike.

Of the first-round matches that were completed, local man Roger Pickford, playing on his green at the Hongkong Football Club, created the biggest upset when he sent former World Outdoor Singles champion Peter Beliss of New Zealand crashing to a 25-8 defeat.

England's Andy Thomson got the best result of the first-round when he beat Australia's World Outdoor Pairs champion, Rex Johnson, 25-18.

But neither Thomson nor Pickford could recapture their form in the second-round with Thomson going down 21-18 to Norfolk Island's Barry Wilson and Pickford losing to fellow Hong Kong player Noel Kennedy, 21-13.

Graham Robertson of Scotland, took advantage of a slack end by Israel's Leon Blum to score a maximum four-count and snatch a 21-19 win, while Wynne Richards also reached the quarter-finals recovering from a 20-16 deficit with a run of 1/3/1 that edged out Canada's Keith Roney, 21-20.

In the quarters Kennedy, Richards and Bransky all notched up easy wins but Robertson had to survive a nailbiting last end before beating Wilson 21-20.

Robertson then moved up a gear and ended the hopes of Kennedy with a 21-15 victory while Richards picked up a four-maximum, followed

by a double, to beat Bransky by the same scoreline.

The final saw the Scot produce his best form taking an 18-7 lead after 16 ends. But, Richards is a redoubtable fighter and he picked up nine shots over the next five ends to rally at 18-16 before Robertson halted the run with a double and a single to win 21-16.

Having served warning that he was in good form, Robertson then joined Scottish international colleague, Alex Marshall, for an assault on the Pairs title.

Wins in their opening seven section matches all but assured the Scots of a place in the knockout stages with their fine run coming to an end in round eight when Welshmen Robert Weale and Will Thomas notched-up a 20-14 result that made almost certain of their place in the final stages.

Mark McMahon and Noel Kennedy, winners of the event two years ago, went through in third place with Canada's Ronnie Jones and Keith Roney taking Section B's fourth spot.

In Section A England's Wynne Richards and Andy Thomson finished top with nine wins and a draw out of their 11 matches, followed closely by Israel (Cecil Bransky and Leon Blum), Hong Kong's David Tso and George Souza and Laka Rawali and Tau Nancie from Papua New Guinea.

The big surprise was the fact that neither New Zealand (Peter Belliss and Maurice Symes), defending champions Australia (Trevor Morris and Rex Johnson) nor Ireland's Stan Espie and John McCloughlin, managed to qualify.

The quarter-finals produced three comfortable wins for Hong Kong, and their second outfit from the Craigenower Cricket Club, Tso and Souza, and Scotland, while

England had a tough struggle against Canada.

The Canadians moved into a 12-9 lead after 13 ends, although with two ends to play England had pulled back to lead 16-15. It wasn't until this point that England really pulled away, with two doubles giving them a 20-15 victory.

In the semi-finals, however, it all went wrong for Richards and Thomson. Having beaten Tso and Souza by 20 shots in the section matches, they saw the result reversed with the Craigenower pair winning 25-10 after 19 ends.

Kennedy and McMahon made the early running against the Scots and opened up a 7-2 lead after six ends but by the 13th end the Hong Kong pair were amazingly 14-7 behind.

That left them with a lot to do and Robertson and Marshall then coasted to a 23-12 win.

The final started cautiously with singles on the opening four ends producing a two-all scoreline before Tso and Souza went ahead 6-2 three ends later. But, 11 shots over the next nine ends took Robertson and Marshall into a 15-6 lead and they continued to an 18-8 scoreline before their opponents conceded with one end left to play.

"We knitted well from the opening game and played as well as we have ever done," said Robertson afterwards. "My win in the singles was a great boost and I'm particularly pleased to have joined Alex for the double as he has had a lot of near misses in recent months."

There will be no Classic this year as Hong Kong will be hosting the prestigious Pacific Bowls Championship but organisers are hoping it will return to the calendar in 1992.

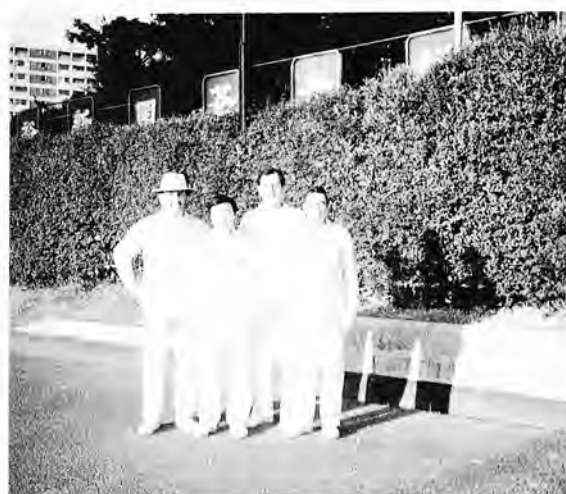

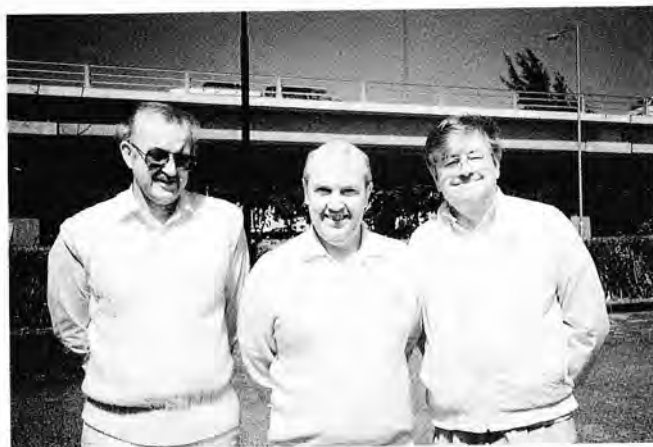

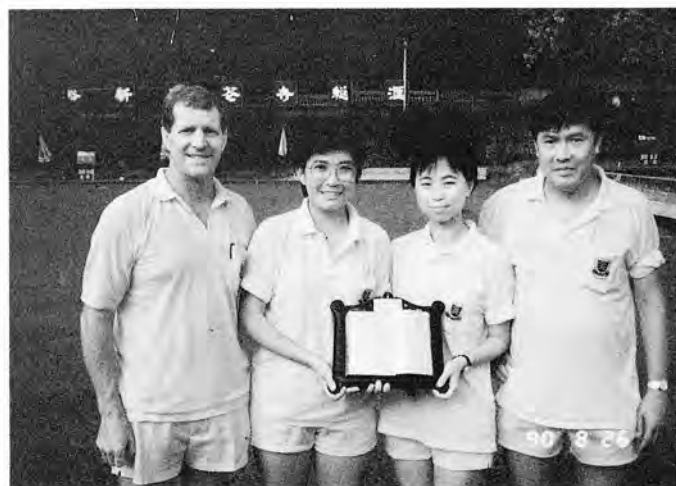

In addition to the above National Competitions the National Competitions Panel also assumed responsibility for running the Classic Qualifying Competitions.

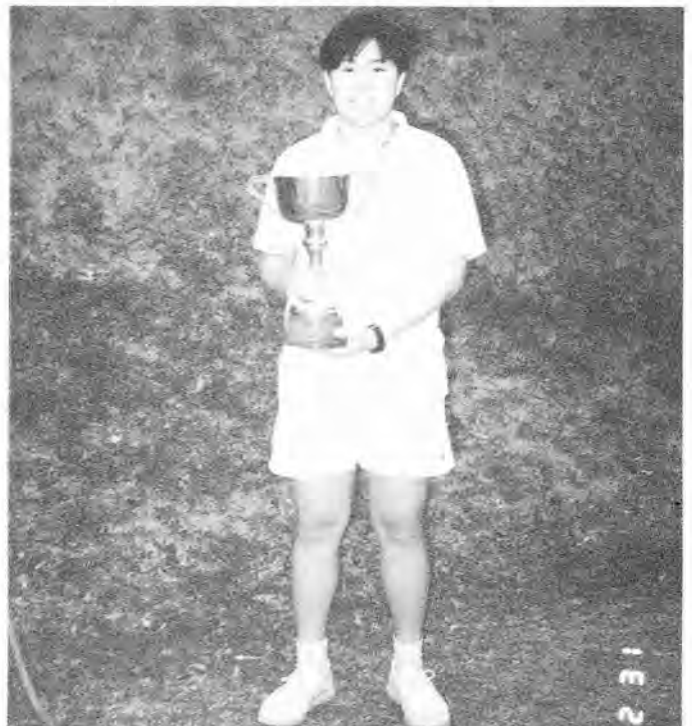
For the Pairs competition a total of five clubs were eligible to compete for one place in the competition and a round robin competition was held

# Reflections

One of the problems we experience within the lawn bowls scene is the lack of retired but active bowlers becoming involved in the administration of the sport. The history of the local game and its roots within the club community has meant that many bowlers, on retiring, have returned to their country of origin or, indeed, emigrated to a different one. There has tended to be a preponderance of expatriates on the executive committees and this continuing situation tends to fragment any continuity of leadership. Of course this situation has its good points, the prevention of the creation of an "establishment" being one.

With various aspects of post 1997 land use being uncertain and with resettlement being a consideration for many, the next ten years will be very important in deciding the twenty-first century profile of lawn bowls in the territory. The sport is going to need committed and stable guidance and identifying and encouraging future officers must become one of our priorities.

The 1990 Classic, despite the early rain, once again demonstrated our ability to achieve maximum enjoyment and efficiency with least fuss. Our reputation abroad is well known and we are now ready to accept the greater responsibility of the Pacific Bowls Championship in October. It promises to be a memorable fortnight and it is to be hoped that the weather stays fair throughout. It would be a great pity if the Classic is not revived in 1992. The enlarged format and extra evening games increased interest both on and off the green, fulfilling to an even greater degree its *raison d'être*.

The new league season starts earlier than usual to accommodate the Pacific Bowls Championship and it remains to be seen whether any challenges emerge to meet Craigengower's defence of the mens' first division title and to upset K.C.C.'s defense of the ladies' equivalent. Football Club have interesting additions to their ranks but perhaps the strongest challenge will come from K.C.C.'A' who have once again been meticulous in their preparation. In the ladies' league I.R.C. can be depended upon to go close with U.S.R.C. not far off the running.

The emergence of sponsored invitational events for prize money has provided extra spice to local competition and it is only to be hoped that there will be further developments in that direction. The stimulus of competition makes for concentration and consistency, attributes we all strive for.

## Obituary — Arthur Olivier
